We must simply and soberly ask, "When it comes to our lives and the purpose and meaning for our lives, what worldview will we put our faith in?" What do you think of this statement? How does this impact your faith?
3. Read Genesis 1:26-27; 31. How does the fact that we were made in Gods image affect your everyday live and how we interact with others who are also made in Gods image? How could this speak into our purpose?
4. Read Isaiah 43:6-7. This passage tells us that we were created for Gods glory. What does it look like to glorify God?

5. Read Matthew 5:13-16. What does this passage say about why we are here and what we are to do?
6. What is the purpose of letting your light shine? What does it look like to hide your light?
7. Read 1 Peter 2:9-10 and Matthew 22:35-39. What do we see in these passages as our purpose in life?
3.1 Peter 4:10 (LB) says: "God has given each of you some special abilities; be sure to use them to help each other." What are some of the special abilities that God has given you? How might God want to use them in His purpose for your life?
